TASTING NOTES

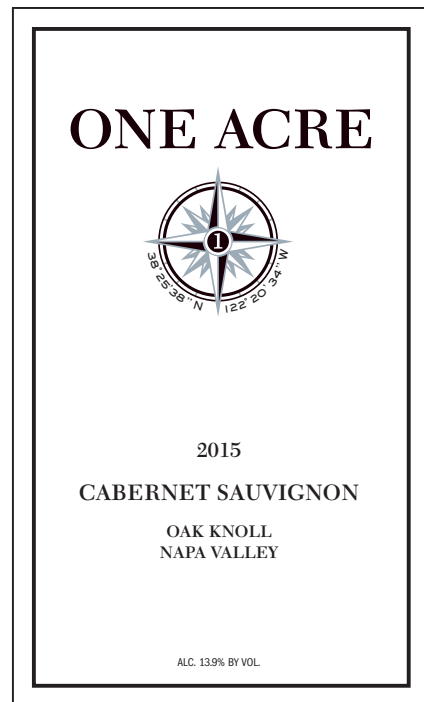
The 2015 One Acre Porchview Vineyard from the Oak Knoll District AVA displays a deep magenta color with ruby red accents. Notes of plum, raspberry, blackberry, spice, vanilla and cedar reveal themselves, yielding to an earthy minerality and graphite notes on the palate. Ripe tannins and a fresh, vibrant acidity complement the aromas, giving the wine a rich and satisfying finish. This is a classic vintage with great aging potential that is quite enjoyable in its youth.

VINEYARD - PORCHVIEW, OAK KNOLL DISTRICT

This first of the One Acre single vineyards was planted by Dave Becker in 2002 and continues to be organically and sustainably farmed by him personally. Situated at the base of an alluvial fan on the western hillsides of the Napa Valley, it is shielded from the hot late afternoon sun. The soil is loamy clay over gravel from Dry Creek's ancient creek bed, which allows roots to go deep extracting character from the soil. The vines are tightly spaced resulting in low yields, small clusters and tiny berries with intense flavors.

VINTAGE 2015 - LESS IS MORE

The growing season got off to an early start with unseasonably warm temperatures in February and March. The drought which continued to devastate much of California had largely ended in Napa, though the winter's early end resulted in late February bud break. Cold temperatures at flowering caused uneven fruit set, further reducing yields. Notwithstanding these challenges, the 2015 vintage progressed wonderfully, resulting in an excellent, yet smaller than average, harvest.
